What A Day For A Festival!

It was a glorious October day in Silver Lake Village... upper 60s and not a cloud in the sky. One would be hard pressed to order up a day any better suited to a village celebration of the coming autumn season.

Entertainment began at the Village Amphitheater in Salo Park with the St. Anthony High School Jazz Band under the direction of Andy Erickson. This fine group performed a variety of music ranging from the swing classic "In The Mood" to more contemporary jazz literature, and even including a big band jazz version of the familiar "Beer Barrel Polka." The band featured a number of student soloists including alto sax and trombone.

Andy told the audience that when he agreed to bring the band to Fall Fest he paid a visit to Silver Lake Village and the amphitheater to get the 'lay of the land,' since he had not been there before. When he arrived he was confronted with a sea of mud and not much else, leaving him dubious about the band's ability to set up and perform.

He was assured by the crew that things would be cleaned up and presentable in time for Fall Fest, and he had to admit they kept their word. While the final canopy on the amphitheater was not installed, the seating area was sodded and the performance stage and all walk paths were clean and dry. Mr. Erickson extended his compliments for the transformation.

Following the Jazz Band, it was The St. Anthony Civic Orchestra's turn to shine. Under the baton of conductor Carol Jensen this group proved to be a well-rehearsed chamber orchestra featuring some



fine musicianship. They performed a variety of music but the crowd pleaser was their grand finale, a medley of themes from the Star Wars movies. This performance was augmented by a spontaneous virtual light saber duel performed by two animated teenaged audience members. Both the orchestra and their impromptu dance duo received loud applause from the appreciative audience.

When the strains of "Star Wars" had died out, activity shifted from the amphitheater to the main show stage where the present dignitaries and primary sponsors of Fall Fest

were scheduled to address the gathering. This was preceded by a welcoming vocal parody of "Santa Lucia." As written and performed by Marilyn Jenson of The Village Condominiums sales staff, this venerable Italian operatic theme was transformed into a song extolling the joys and benefits of life in The Village. In addition to Marilyn's fine voice, the end of

each phrase was emphatically punctuated by the robust baritone of Dan Hunt of Hunt Associates, codeveloper of The Village Condominiums at Silver Lake Village.

Mayor Jerry Faust of St. Anthony Village next took the stage, welcoming everyone to Fall Fest. He then introduced members of the St. Anthony Village City Council and staff to share the stage and be recognized for their vision and commitment in pursuing this redevelopment known as Silver Lake Village being celebrated at Fall Fest.

Where else but Silver Lake Village Fall Fest could one come upon what appeared to be a perfectly normal human being carrying on a conversation with... well... a giant cell phone?







